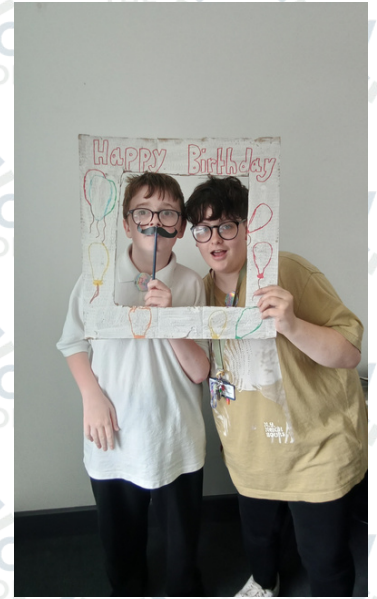
What have we learnt this term?
